vi) Procedure for admissions, curriculum transaction and evaluation:

Admission –The admission process shall be initiate in August and shall be kept open till September end for the first semester. The admission shall be finalised by October end and SLMs shall be distributed in November. The minimum eligibility condition shall be 50% marks in 10+2 from any State board or CBSE Board.

<u>Curriculum transaction</u> –

<u>Activity Planner</u>: The exercise of preparing an activity planner will be the responsibility of the affiliated under graduate colleges and the nodal person shall be the principal of the college as well as the Coordinator approved by Jharkhand State Open University advisory committee.

Evaluation – The continuous component shall comprise 30% and the term-end shall comprise 70%. The continuous evaluation shall be in the form of Tutor Marked Assignments or mid-term examinations. In order to pass a course, a learner must secure minimum 40% Marks in each course/paper. All examinations shall be conducted by the Controller of Examination as per examination Rules and Regulations in the Jharkhand State Open University.
